What's the EIOD?



"E" for Everyone

ETOD is good for everyone – from homeowners and renters, to seniors and families. ETOD can benefit your community by adding housing options, encouraging locally owned businesses, promoting walkable streets and more. ETOD has particular benefits for Black and Brown communities that have historically faced disinvestment. Right now, ETOD projects are being built in more than half of Chicago's 50 wards – great places like a cooperative grocery store, a print shop, a dance studio and a comedy club. With ETOD, affordability is everything. When developers build housing without considering

community needs, long-time residents can be priced out. On the other hand, housing near transit can make room for residents, offer diverse and affordable housing types, and prevent displacement.
